Major Activities

The institution every year conducts extension activities as a matter of social responsibilities these activities were conducted through National Service Scheme, Rotaract Club and Cultural Forum.

### A. National Service Scheme:

- 1. The NSS unit actively took part in wild life week organised by the department of wild life and the district administration, shimoga, Apart from usual competitions, the volunteers took part in the Jatha on 19.09.11 to create awareness in public about the importance of wild life in the conservation of ecology.
- 2. AIDS prevention programme was conducted on 01.12.11. Apart form the Jatha programme an interaction was held with HIV positive lady she spoke about her challenging experiences.
- 3. The special NSS camp was held at a nearly village called pillangiri. The major project during the camp was cleaning "Pushkaviri", near ranganatha swamy temple. This drew the attention of the government and the government realised that the 'pushkarini' is a historical monument. Finally government funds for the renovation of pushkarini. This was a fine example of institutional social responsibility.

### **B. Cultural Forum:**

- 4. Gandhi jayanthi was celebrated on 02 Oct 2011. Nearly fifty students participated in 'Sharamadhana' in the vicinity of the college and cleaned the vicinity by remobing dist, plastic garbage and weed. The staff and students also brought the pressure in the city municipality to clean the nearby drainage from which foul smell was coming the municipality responded to our appeal and acted immediately.
- 5. International Women's day was celebrated on 10.03.2012. photo exhibition of women achievers and their achievement was arranged to inspire the girls, old students of the college and some women association of the city took part in the programme.
- 6. Free Eye check up camp was held in association with 'Vasan Eye Care', Shimoga, apart from the students, and the staff, the family members of the staff and students took the benefit of the free eye check up programme.
- 7. The special programme worthy to be highlighted here is the extension of support to Anti Corruption of movement headed by Anna Hazare. The whole management with its constituent colleges participated in the week long programme held in the month of January 2012, A procession was taken out holding the lighted candle in the evening.
- 8. Dr. Harish Hande Magsays awardee was invited to the college on 01.08.2011 to deliver special lecture on 'Tapping Solar Energy'. The students were motivated to motivate others to use solar energy. The students spread the message about he need to use solar power during the special NSS camp.
